## OPTIONAL PARTICIPATION 7th & 8th Graders—Very Cool!

The Illinois Music Educators Association, ILMEA, is the Illinois state-level affiliate of NAFME: The National Association for Music Education. Students from around the state audition to perform in an ILMEA ensemble (band, chorus, or orchestra). Bond County is in District 6, and our auditions take place at Mascoutah Jr. High School. Audition preparation consists of each student either preparing instrumental music or choral music. They will audition in front of a judge, and their score will be recorded and later compiled with all of the other students who auditioned. The district 6 officials will then choose the best students for each ensemble—band, chorus, orchestra—depending on what the student auditioned for. If a student is accepted into one of the ensembles, they then prepare music for the District 6 festival which will be at Belleville West High School on Saturday, November 17th, 2018. Students must meet preparation deadlines set by Mr. Cox in order to audition. There are fees for each person who auditions and or is accepted. Please mark on the contract if you and your child are interested in ILMEA auditions.

# Requirements

## Attendance

Attendance is required at all rehearsals and all performances. The more we practice together, the better our performances will be! If one person is missing from the ensemble, the sound and feel of the music changes. This is especially true in marching band. Music is more fun with more people!

Be There!

Excused absences are granted in extreme situations. If such an extreme situation occurs please text Mr. Cox as soon as you can.

## Marching Attire

Students will have a band uniform assigned to them during band camp for all marching band events. Students will need to provide black shoes and **black socks**, and must purchase band gloves. I will have band gloves available for purchase. Marching band polo shirts and khaki shorts may be utilized if the weather calls for it.

### Formal attire for concerts

Girls: school appropriate dresses, skirts, dress pants, blouse (hair out of face)

Boys: dress shirt, slacks, and shoes (hair fixed)

# Requirements

## Band Lessons & At-Home Practice

Each student will be assigned a lesson time they will attend weekly. All students will be required to fill out weekly goal sheets. This sheet will help the student to develop the skill of setting a goal and working towards the completion of that goal.

Practice is **THE** most important part of learning music with an instrument. I recommend at least 120 minutes of practice a week. Some students will find that 120 minutes is not enough for them to master their music for that week's playing test, and might need to practice more. Practice must take place preferably every day in order to be a rock star on your instrument! One day of rest would also be great.

Example: 20 minutes a day for 6 days with a day to rest

## Preparedness & Participation

Students must have their instrument at school every day they have band/lessons. Each student must have the following for every rehearsal and lesson: music, instrument, a sharpened pencil or two, reeds for woodwind players, oil for brass players, and any other supplies that are needed for the individual student.

Points are based on compliance.

# Instrument Repair

## Cleaning & Repair

Music & Arts

\*Refer to the following guidelines.

\*If you are interested in purchasing an instrument through Music & Arts let me know and I will send information home.

### Halpin Music & Music & Arts Customers

I meet with the music representatives every Thursday. In many cases a loaner instrument can be given to your student while their instrument is being repaired. Contact me if you think there is something wrong with your child's instrument and I will arrange for the pick up/drop off.

If you own your own instrument I can arrange to have Music & Arts repair it. Be sure your name and phone number is on a piece of paper inside the instrument case along with your name and number on the ID tag attached to your instrument. Remove all personal items from the case. The company will contact you with a quote. You can then determine your course of action.

## SCHOOL INSTRUMENT RENTAL

There is a \$75 rental fee for any student who needs to use a school instrument for the year. This includes all percussionists. You will need to fill out a rental form for your child and send it in with the correct payment made out to GJHS. This fee covers the general maintenance of the instrument. Damages to the instrument that require repair or replacement are the responsibility of the renter and not the school. By signing the contract and rental agreement you understand the aforementioned guidelines.

Brass & Woodwind Instruments — \$75 per year

Percussionists — \$75 per year

Marching season rental only — \$37 per year

# PRACTICE TIPS

Every good musician knows that regular practice is a must, but did you know that careless practice can actually make you worse? Before you tell your parent or your teacher that you have decided not to practice, think about the WHO, WHAT, WHERE, WHEN and HOW of practice that will help you play better and enjoy music more.

## WHO?

YOU! Good practice involves your mind, your body, your emotions, and the music. Your parent or teacher may be able to force you to spend time playing the notes, but only YOU can focus your mind and your feeling on the sounds you are producing, so that the music you play is beautiful and expressive.

## WHAT?

Practice that progresses toward excellence will include:

- Warm-ups
- Review of scales, etudes, or pieces you have already learned
- Your new assignment
- Something you really love playing, or just for fun (maybe even make up a piece on your own)

## WHERE?

It's always best to have a special practice place carved out somewhere in your home that everyone knows about. This will help keep you consistent with your practicing, and it will also help other family members respect your practice time.

Choose a semi-quiet area with a chair and a sturdy music stand. There should be proper lighting and a place to store your musical accessories such as sheet music, pencils, markers, notebook and a metronome (specific instruments will require a drawer or cupboard for other things such as extra strings, reeds, valve oil, etc.). There should be minimal distractions such as TV, radio, other children, pets or telephone.

## WHEN?

Dr. Suzuki said, "Only on the days that you eat!" The best plan is to make practice a part of your daily routine. If you know you will practice at a certain time every day, it will happen with very few exceptions.

## HOW?

This is a VERY important question! Many students practice by playing straight through a piece or other assignment (often as quickly as possible) as if they were at a recital, then go on to the next thing, no matter what happened. Money won't buy better playing, but well spent practice time will. Here are some hints for getting the most for your practice "dollar."

- Set goals to try to accomplish in each practice session
- Be sure you know what the passage should sound like
- Work on the most challenging spots first
- Break the music down into small sections
- (How do you eat an elephant? - One bite at a time!)
- Repeat the passage many times AFTER you get it right
- Before you end each practice session, play the entire piece, and enjoy!
